

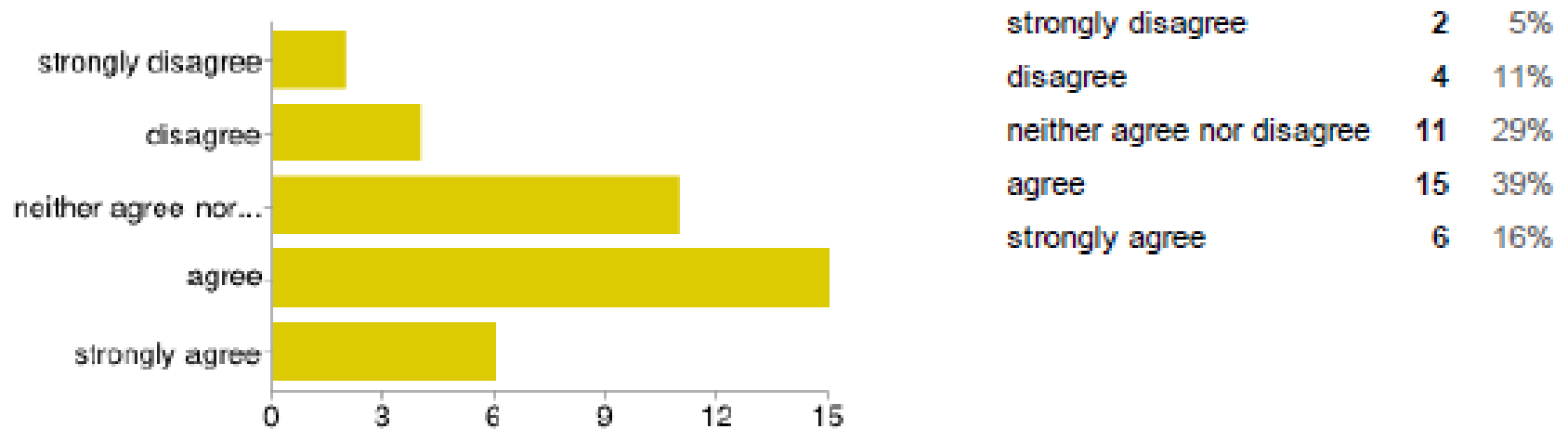

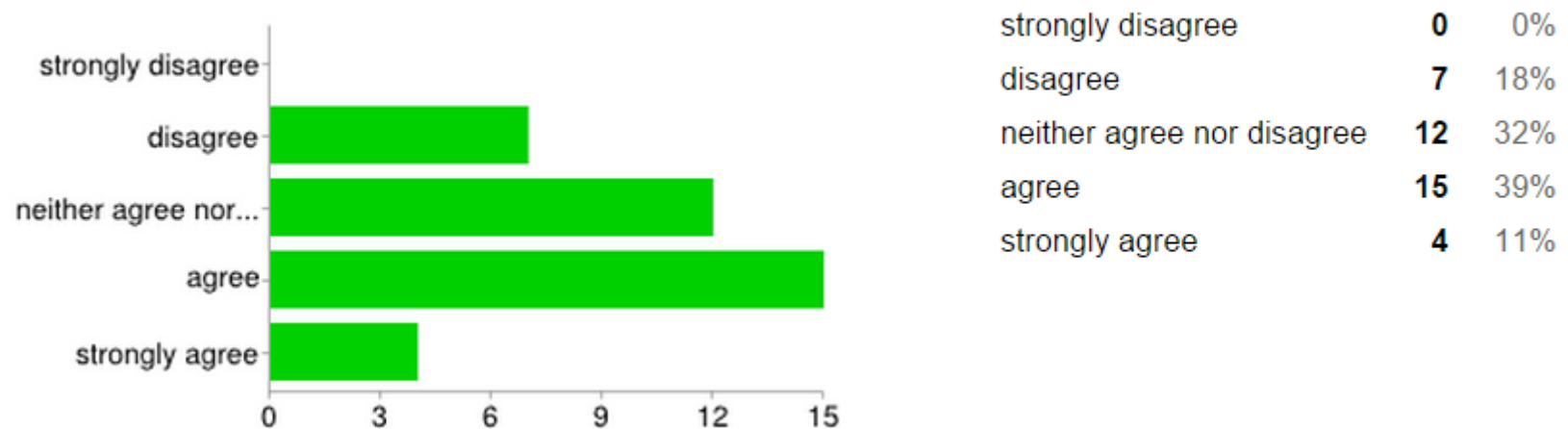

## More skills in specialisation subjects [What do you expect from this project:]



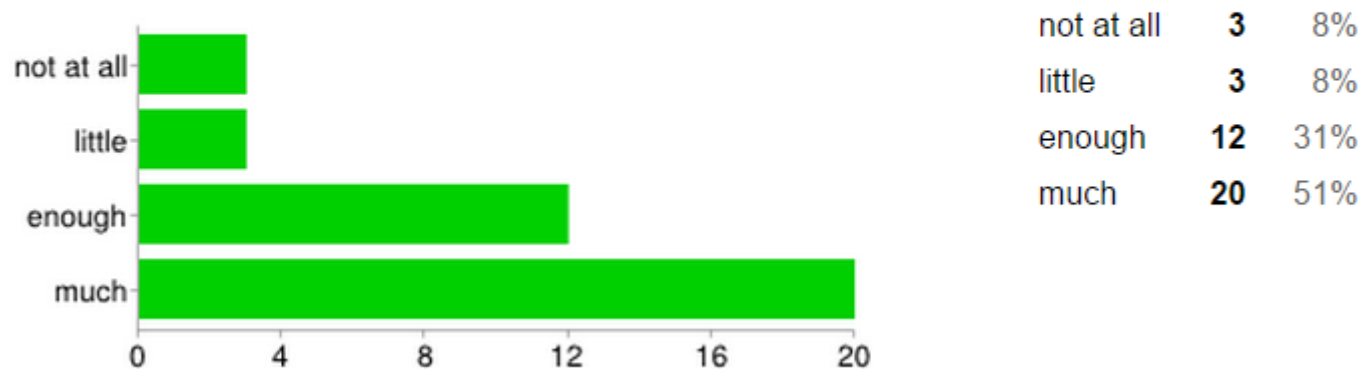
The same results appear for specialisation subjects.

Assess the effectiveness and validity of the project:

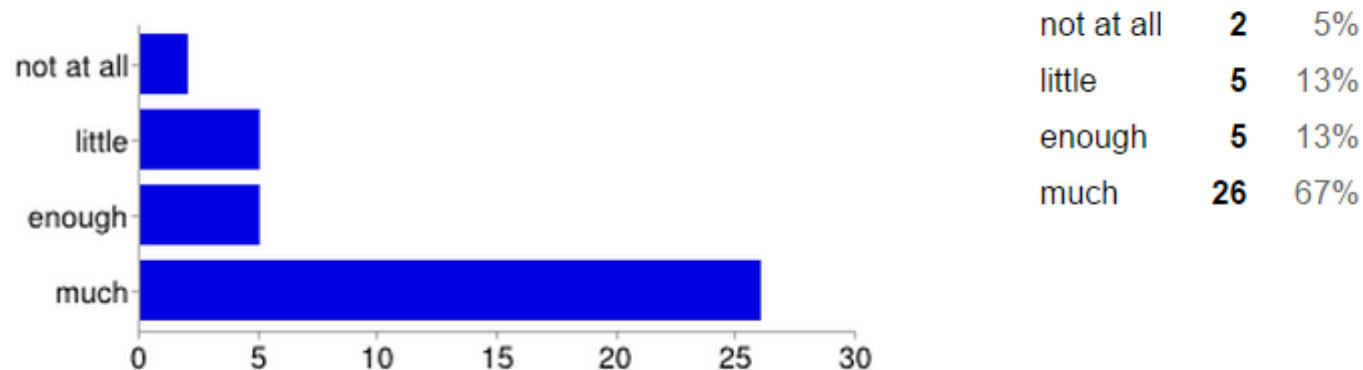
- formative and educational aspect

The answers to the question that ask to speak on the importance of the study are all extremely positive:

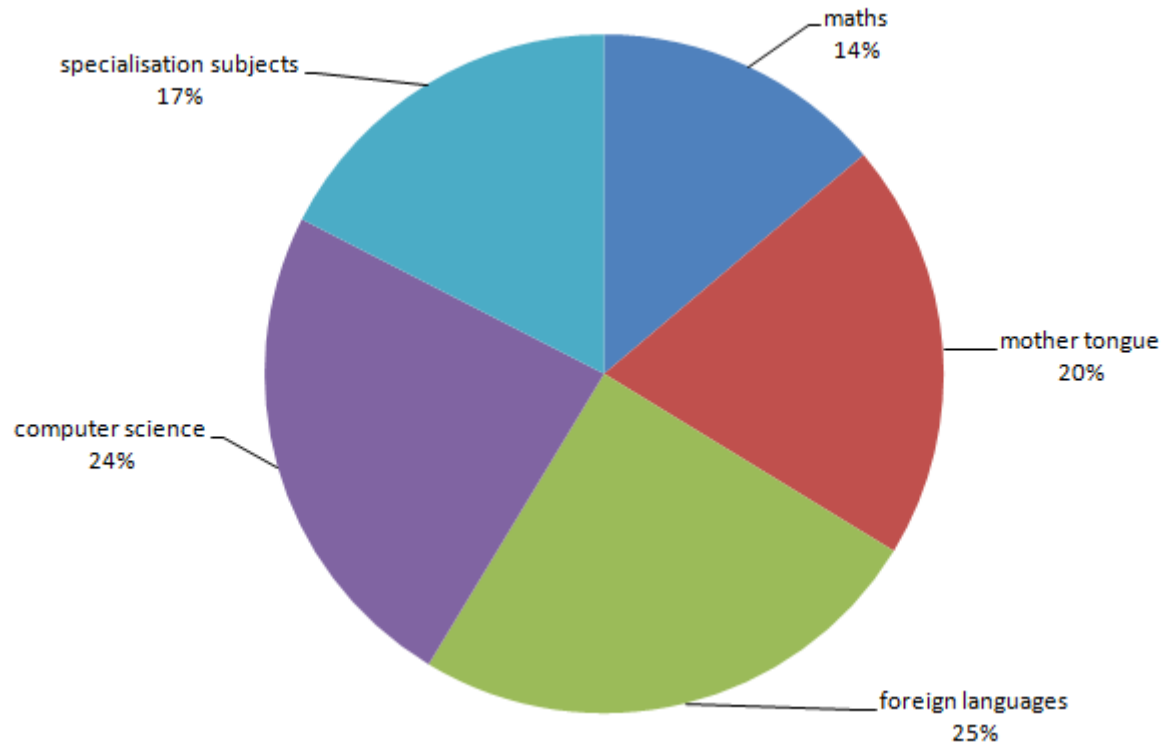
**I think that finishing my studies will help me have more competences for my professional development**



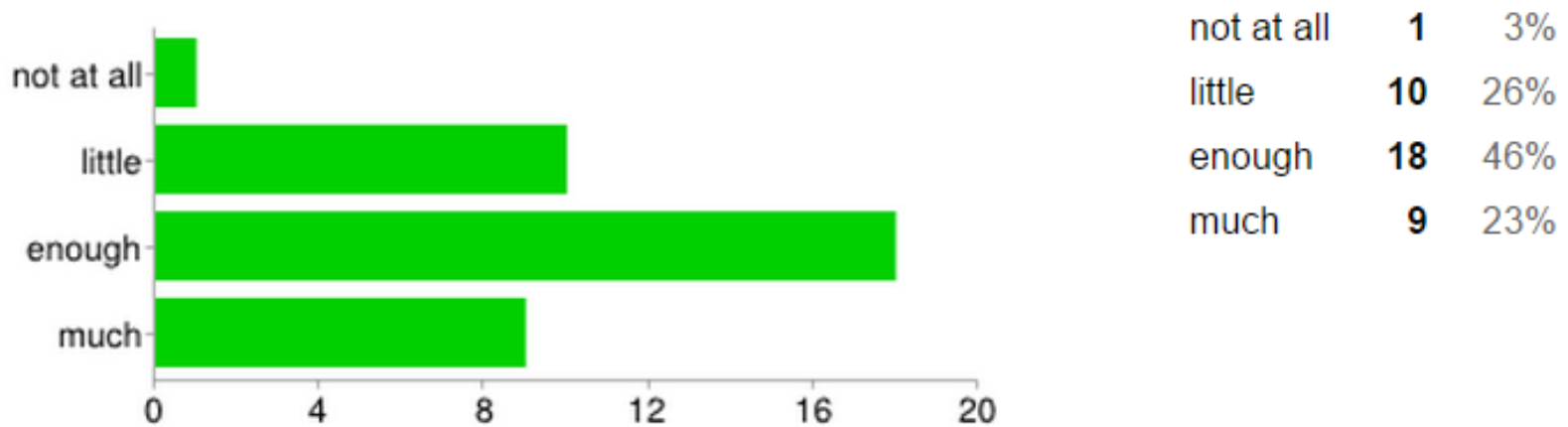
**I need at least one degree to find a job in the future, a well-paid and prestigious job**



An additional reason relevant for the students on the importance of the study is based on learning new things referred to the contents and expected competences on the following subjects



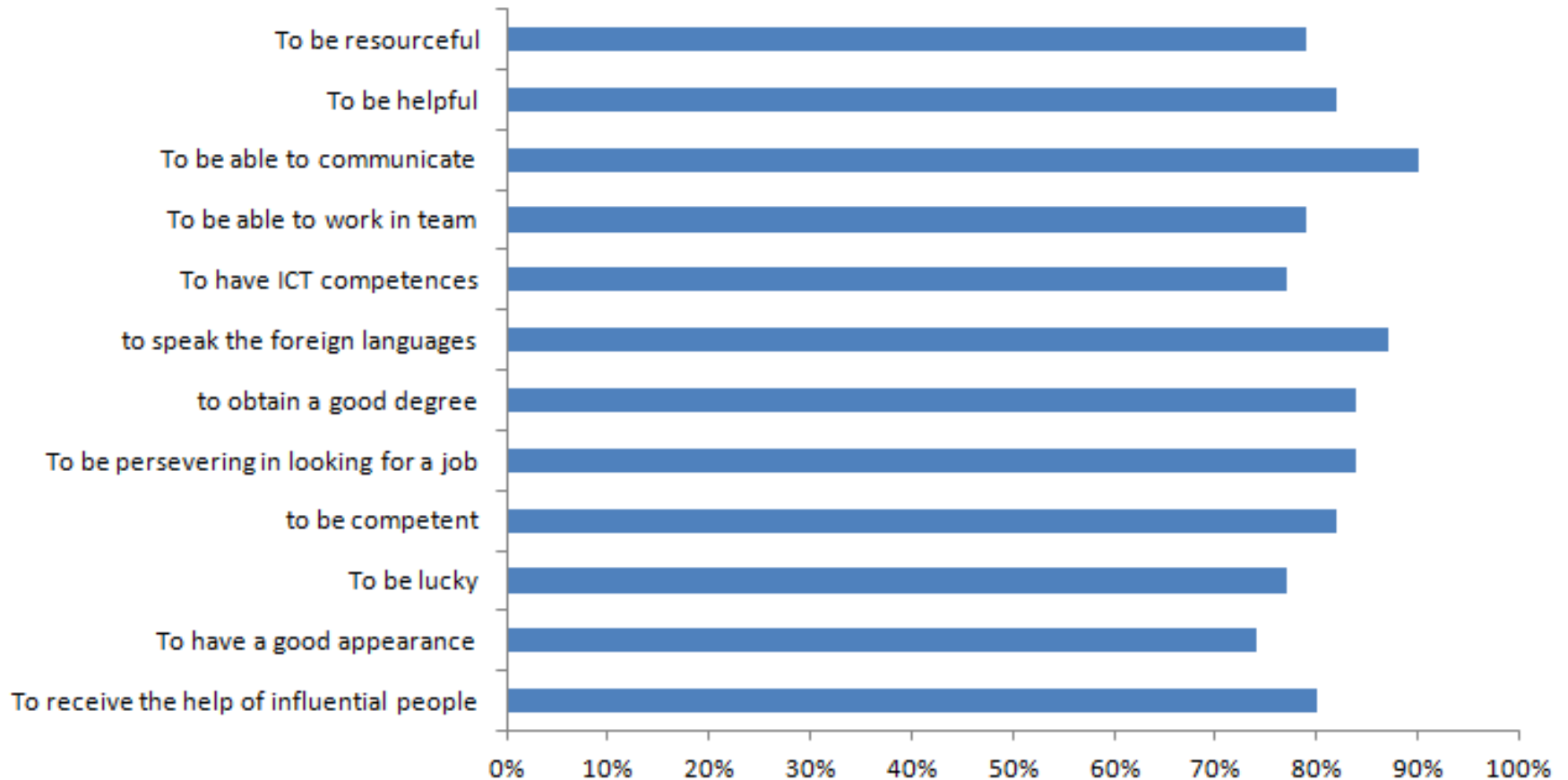
## My future in the labour market is a source of concern



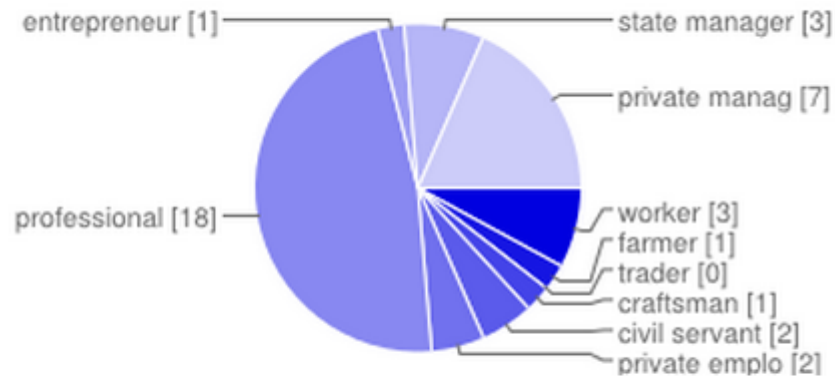
Students care about their future careers but they are worried about future because of:

private manager	7	18%

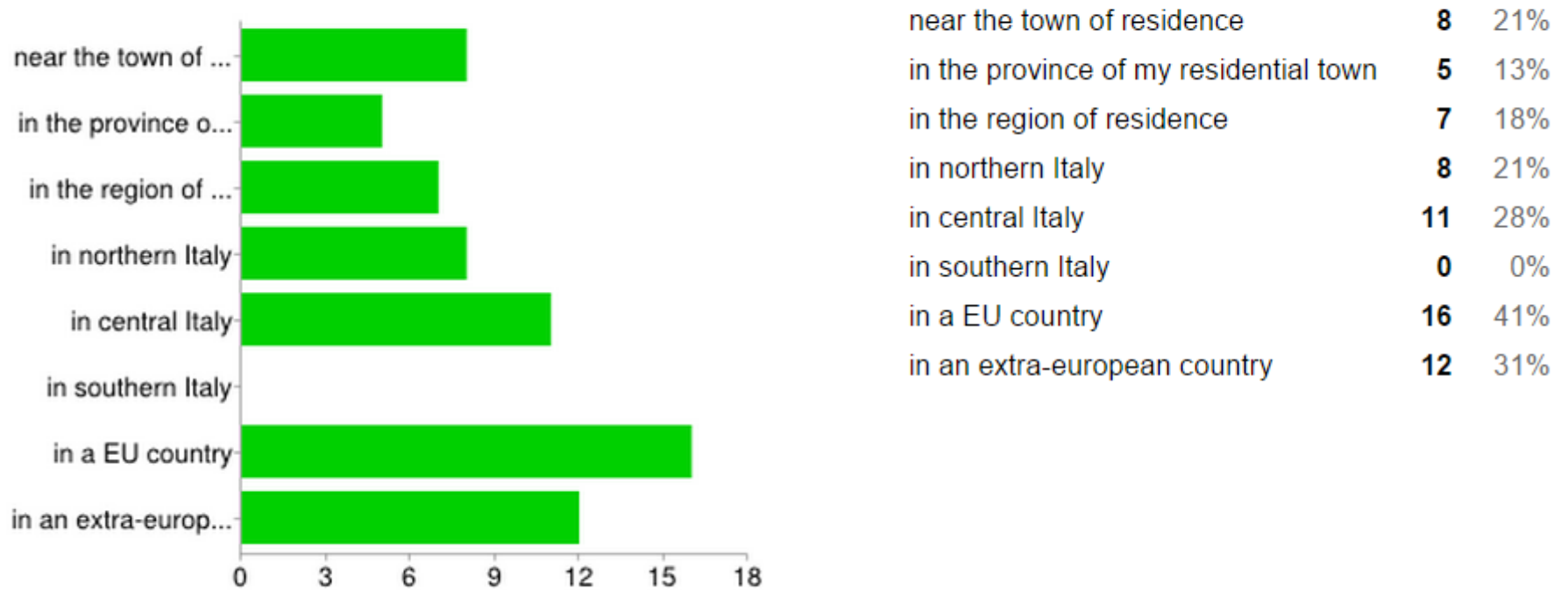
Manual labor is certainly to be considered as the last choice for many young people.

- poor support of the families in encouraging them
- influence of advertising
